
### **In the Community**

We pray for all affected by adverse weather events, especially in Westland and Buller where heavy rain is causing flooding and landslips, closing roads and requiring residents to prepare to evacuate. We give thanks for the work of Civil Defence and the emergency services helping people deal with the conditions.

**Life Guide Lenten Bible Study** - "Hope, Your Heart's Deepest Longings" This is an inductive Bible study, designed to help you discover for yourself what Scripture is saying. The study includes three types of questions. *Observation* questions ask about the basic facts: who, what, when, where and how. *Interpretation* questions delve into the meaning of the passage. *Application* questions help you discover the implications of the text for growing in Christ. These three keys unlock the treasures of Scripture. There is no cost for participants but please bring a Bible. The Reverend Dr Tony Martin will lead the studies on Wednesday evenings at St Michael's Church (venue to be confirmed), starting at 7.30pm, with a cup of coffee or tea, finishing at 9.00pm. The first study of the series will be on Wednesday 2<sup>nd</sup> March, Ash Wednesday.

**"Sentinels" Lenten Study**" - This year's Lenten Study from Theology House in Christchurch and the Anglican Movement (Diocese of Wellington) is entitled "Sentinels: Discerning New Life". Parishioners are encouraged to attend the Life Guide Lenten Bible Study, but those who are unable to attend the Wednesday evening study may like to be part of a smaller self-led group. Groups will be based in Andersons Bay (after the Midweek Communion service) and Macandrew Bay (Tuesdays at 10.30am). Electricians continued with the rewiring, and the work on the tile roof of the church is almost complete.
